Introductory comments...

We are gathered together here in the sight of God, and in the face of this company to join together this man and this woman in holy matrimony; ... it is not by any to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly; but reverently, discreetly, advisedly, soberly, and in the fear of God.

Traditionally, marriage ceremonies have said that each should love, honor and cherish the other until death parts them. In the light of the deeper meaning of the Scriptures, we would like to go a step further and state that a true marriage means intimacy, openness, tenderness, respect, appreciation, self-giving, and at times, self-sacrifice for each other's welfare and happiness. With this attitude a union is formed that only death could sever. Marriage is a joyous occasion. Marriage is an institution of God. It is the uniting of two hearts and lives, and is not to be entered into inadvertently or lightly, but rather reverently and discreetly.

For as much as Sherri and Josh have consented together in holy wedlock, and have witnessed the same before God, their families and friends, pledging their vows each to the other, and have declared the same by giving and receiving rings and by joining hands, I do, by the virtue of the authority bestowed upon me as a minister of the Gospel, by the ordinance of God and the laws of this state, pronounce you husband and wife, in the name of the Father and the Son and in the Holy Spirit.
